## The Motorways of the Sea (MoS)

- Climate change and environmental degradation are existential threats.
- The transport sector's GHG emissions have increased: **25%** of the EU total.
- The Green deal: 90% GHG reduction from transport by 2050.
- Roughly 80% of all goods are transported by sea.
- Short sea shipping stands for <u>ca 65%</u> of all cargo transiting through EU ports.
- That equals <u>2.5 billion tons</u> of cargo and more than <u>400 million</u> passengers.
- One of the main MoS objectives is to boost short sea shipping in the EU.

- Encouraging <u>new</u> and <u>more maritime connections</u>.
- Supporting deployment of ICT solutions for transport.
- Development of **port infrastructure**.
- Diversifying energy usage.



### Stepping up the maritime dimension in TEN-T

- Investments needed in all transport sectors. Especially in the maritime sector.
- Investments needed in fleet renewals, alternative fuels infrastructure & last mile connections to the TEN-T.
- Eco-incentives should be assessed to boost maritime transport.
- The TEN-T revision provides an opportunity for improvement of the maritime dimension.
- Our resources are limited. Grants from the EU alone will <u>not</u> be enough.



#### Outlook

- The ongoing pandemic underlines the need to step up our efforts.
- The economic recovery will be long but the needs are immediate.
- The creation of a **European Maritime Space** will reinforce the maritime pillar.
- The maritime sector <u>can</u> be part of the recovery solution.
- More attention is needed for short sea shipping, on-shore power supply and hinterland connectivity.
- Ports play a big role with multifaceted properties as hubs.



#### Conclusions

- Maritime ports are vital for international connectivity, the economy and for the European regions.
- The development of ports is essential to contribute to our political objectives.
- Current complexities and fragmentation of procedures must be overcome.
- Ports have a great potential to become clean energy hubs.
