

Building on a long tradition that goes back to 1996, ESPO and EcoPorts regularly monitor the top environmental priorities of European port authorities. This data is important as it identifies the high priority environmental issues on which ports are working and it sets the framework for guidance and initiatives to be taken by ESPO. The current outcome (October 2017) builds on data from 91 ports.*

*As this top 10 is based on EcoPorts data, it is to be noted that it includes data from 5 non-EU ports.
